

## EntreComp4Transition: Building upon the EntreComp Framework for a green and digital Transition

The twin green and digital transition is expected to bring benefits to all parts of EU society, including businesses. EU citizens upskilling and re-skilling in entrepreneurship domain is on the centre of the radar and especially green and digital skills. Participation in and contribution to sustainable solutions paths the way to stronger and more resilient Europe, and entrepreneurship is the key to enable this change.

Building on the EntreComp framework, the Erasmus+ project aims at directly supporting the twin transition throughout the EU.

It fosters the creation of new, profitable business opportunities by laying the foundations of a new profile, the “green transition facilitator”. It will do so by developing innovative learning path and materials for students, delivered via a MOOC, to fill the gaps between education and the labour market.



### GENERAL AIMS

1. Foster new, innovative and multidisciplinary approaches to teaching and learning.
2. Improve the quality and relevance of skills developed.
3. Stimulate a sense of initiative and entrepreneurial attitudes, mind-sets and skills.
4. Facilitate the flow and co-creation of knowledge.
5. Building and supporting education and training systems.
6. Foster corporate social responsibility.



### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

1. Establish alliances (Country Clusters), gathering HEIs, VET providers, SMEs to solve mismatches between education and the labour market in terms of entrepreneurial, digital and green skills.
2. Develop a learning path for VET supported by the EntreComp framework for entrepreneurial, digital and green skills (Open-access MOOC).
3. To pilot the methodology, learning path and MOOC.
4. Ensure sustainability, scalability, replicability of the overall methodology, setting out recommendations for policy-makers for necessary changes to support green transition.

The project will rely on **5 country clusters: Austria, Belgium, Italy, Spain and Turkey**. Clusters will be **transnationally interconnected** and gather main actors from higher and VET education as well as businesses, civil society, and governmental bodies. They will be a key in achieving a systematic impact at European level due to their capacity to deploy the project outcomes on a European scale as well as to transfer them at local, regional, and national level. Such clusters will act as communities where discussion and exchange of information and good practices will be possible, and at the same time contributing to the different activities of the project and enriching its results.

Project promotes lifelong learning and aims to contribute to the European Skills Agenda by ensuring right to training, development and use of skills for both - individuals and businesses – in all the areas. The access of the results of the project will be open, produced materials will be freely and fully accessible, available, and distributed through open licences.



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
